

It is with a great honor we welcome you to the 31st International IPSERA Conference here in Jönköping, Sweden. It has been 21 years since the last IPSERA conference in Jönköping and two years since we last gathered in person to share our passion for the field of purchasing and supply chain management. Although the last two years have been extremely challenging for everyone all around the world, we would like to think we have also gained invaluable lessons and skills going through this unprecedented experience. One of them being the use of online platforms to provide learning opportunities in a form and shape that was not possible before. Consequently, this conference will be the very first IPSERA conference to be held in hybrid format, allowing professionals and academics to share their work both in person and online.

The theme of this conference is "building bridges" which is inspired by the overwhelming collaboration across the world in the last two years to overcome global challenges. We believe that *now* is the time to take a step further, move beyond borders, and collaborate at all levels to strengthen our supply chain. We have begun building bridges here at home where in a unique opportunity the School of Engineering (JTH) and Jönköping International Business School (JIBS) are co-hosting IPSERA 2022 at Jönköping University.

The interest in this year's conference has been heartwarming. We received a total of 191 abstract and paper submissions from 29 countries. Thanks to the effort of our Scientific Committee members, all papers received a double-blind review which yielded 164 final papers to be included in the program. Among these final papers, 43 are competitive, 118 are working papers, and 3 are practitioner papers. These papers will be presented by 236 participants, 170 will be attending the conference in person and 66 will be joining us online. Among the 236 attendees, 93 are PhD students.

The theme of this conference has allowed practitioners and researchers to discuss their papers in the following wide range of purchasing and supply chain topics:

This PDW revisits an "evergreen" topic that is highly relevant for all researchers in the OSCM discipline, reviewing. We are all one way or another part of this critical step in the publishing process. Either we receive comments as authors from review teams or we are part of such review teams as reviewers, AEs or EICs. We have all had various experiences with reviewing. Good ones where the reviews for our manuscripts helped us improve our work or we learned how other members of a review team looked at a manuscript that we had reviewed. But also, bad experiences, like conflicting comments from reviewers on which we did not receive sufficient guidance from the AE, or changes in the requirements brought forward over different review rounds.

PDW 5 – Staying off retraction watch should be an order qualifier, not an order winner

Erik van Raaij - Rotterdam School of Management, Mark Pagell - University College Dublin & Leonardo Marques - Audencia Business School and IPSERA Vice-President

In this workshop, professors Mark Pagell and Erik van Raaij will present and debate issues related to research ethics, research integrity and questionable research practices. Mark will take the perspective of the journal editor, building on his role as Editor-in-Chief for Journal of Supply Chain Management. Erik will take the perspective of the critical reader, science sleuth, or Sherlock Holmes of science. Both agree that the quality of the scholarly record in the field of Purchasing and Supply (Chain) Management needs to be protected, but they don't always agree on how that goal should be achieved. It's up to you, the audience, to make up your mind where you stand on these issues! Whether you are a junior scholar or a seasoned PSM buff, whether you have a strong opinion on these matters or are still "on the fence", please join this session and join the debate!
